appointments:
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As new parents, you have different circumstances and different needs prior to discharge from the maternity ward (BB). The time you spend in hospital is individual, ranging from six hours to a few days. It is your requirements that determine the inpatient time.

After you have given birth, the following criteria must be met prior to discharge

Your bleeding is normal

You do not have a fever

You can urinate as normal

You can move around for shorter distances

You have received information about adequate pain relief

You have had a conversation with a midwife about your delivery

You have received information about breast-feeding, manual pumping and feeding the baby

You have received information about tears and infections

You have received an appointment for follow-up and any other return visits to BB Sös, and you feel confident about what to expect regarding yourself and your baby

For your new-born, the following criteria must be met prior to discharge

Your baby has been latching on correctly or feeding is going according to plan and there is a plan for breast-feeding/feeding your baby, until your next contact with the ward

Your baby has been examined by a paediatrician; POX has been carried out

You have received information about your new-born's breathing, 24-hour routine, skin colour and jaundice in new-borns.

An appointment for a return visit has been made or PKU sampling has been performed

Remember that you are responsible for the following visits

Hearing screening, drop in Mon-Fri 09.00-15.30

Booking of first visit to the paediatric care clinic (BVC)

Booking of post-maternity visit with your midwife at the midwife clinic $\,$

The care chain - to whom can I turn?

After discharge from the hospital, many questions may arise. You will receive support from us at Sös up to one week after birth. Afterwards you should contact BVC and midwife clinic if necessary.
